attempt to obtain anything to the prejudice of the prior and convent of Westminster, or contrary to the composition made by mediation of the king between him and them touching certain manors, obedientiaries, possessions and other things affecting the state of the said prior and convent. [*Fœdera.*]

Respite from knighthood, for life, to Payn de la Le, who is feeble and broken by age; for a fine.

July 20.
Gloucester. Simple protection, for seven years, for the prior and brethren of St. Mary's, Hertleg.

The like for the master and brethren of the lepers of St. Lawrence without Bristol.

July 22.
Gloucester. Grant to Geoffrey de Lezignan the king's brother, in compensation for his losses through not obtaining the land which the king gave him in Ireland, of 500 marks out of the first clear debts of the king's Jewry, except the debts and chattels of Aaron son of Abraham, deceased.

[*Cancelled.*] *Because he surrendered the letter.*

Exemption, for life, of Henry de Drees from being put on assizes, juries or recognitions, and from being made sheriff &c. against his will.

Protection with clause, for one year from Michaelmas, for the archbishop of Armagh.

July 24.
Gloucester. Royal assent to the election of William de Neubiry, monk of Abbendon, to be abbot of that place; with mandate to Master Hugh de Mortuo Mari, official of Canterbury, to do his part herein.

July 26.
Gloucester. Acceptance of a fine of 20 marks of gold which Koc son of Aaron son of Abraham, Jew of London, made with Henry de Bathonia, Philip Lovel, the treasurer, Adam de Greinvill, Simon Passelewe and Thomas Sperun, whereof he has paid 10 marks in the wardrobe, and will pay the remaining 10 marks at the feast of St. Edward, so that he and his wife and children be quit of inquisition and suspicion which the king has against them of chattels and moveables of Aaron his father, concealed and carried away, and so that he have his own houses in London, his charters and muniments made under his name, and his other moveables, as set forth in the said fine.

Mandate to Philip Lovel, the treasurer, and the barons of the Exchequer and the justices appointed to the keeping of the Jews, to cause this to be done and enrolled.

Commitment to the said Koc of the houses late of the said Aaron his father, except the houses which the king gave to William de Waleres, yeoman of the queen; to hold until the feast of St. Edward next, so that the king will aliene them to no one until further order be made by the king's council touching the said houses and goods of the said Aaron which are in the king's hands.

Licence, for life, for John de Frethorne to hunt with his own dogs the hare, the fox, the badger and the cat throughout the forest of Windsor.

Exemption, for life, of Walter de Ebroicis from being put on assizes, juries or recognitions, and from being made sheriff &c. against his will.
