The king lends to William de Sancta Ermina his houses at Haveryng to lodge in, during the king's pleasure; with mandate to Richard de Muntfichet to deliver them to him whenever he is so requested by the said William.

May 5.

Whereas William de Bello Campo of Bedeford, the elder, has granted to William his son all the lands which he held of the king in chief and of others, to hold to him and his heirs; the king, for a fine of 500 marks of silver made by William, the younger, ratifying the grant, has taken his homage for all lands which his father held in chief, granting that he shall retain the lands according to the form of the grant, by the services due.

Gilbert le Oyselur gives $\frac{1}{2}$ mark for having a writ of trespass before the justices at the first assize &c. in the county of Norfolk.

Vacated because on the roll of Fines.

Grant to the bailiffs and burgesses and other good men of Worcester of murage for five years from the Ascension.

Exemption of William de Thornhill from being put on assizes, juries or recognitions, and from being made sheriff &c.

Exemption, for life, for a fine of Baldwin de Kalna of the county of Dorset, who is in holy orders, from taking up the arms of a knight.

Mandate to William de Gloucestria, king's goldsmith, out of the king's money which he has to buy gold for the king, to let Philip Luvel, the treasurer, have 500 marks to deliver to the countess of Flanders for arrears of her fee, and 50 marks to deliver to Baldwin de Avenes for his fee of Easter term last. *And they are patent.*

Grant to John de Burgo the elder that he may plead in the king's name for certain lands in the manor of Causton, which was the king's demesne, which lands were aliened from the manor before the king conferred it upon Hubert de Burgo, father of the said John; so that if the king recover the said lands by judgment of the court, they shall remain to the said John and his heirs.

Like letters to the said John touching the advowsons of the churches of Westhale, co. Suffolk, and Arleg, co. Stafford, which were aliened from the king's demesnes before such demesnes were conferred upon the said Hubert.

Mandate to Humphrey de Bohun, earl of Hereford and Essex, Humphrey de Bohun his son, Reynold son of Peter, Roger de Mortuo Mari, William de Ebroicis, Walter de Clifford, William de Stotevyl, Griffin son of Wenunewen, Thomas Corbet, John Lestrangle, John son of Alan, Fulk son of Warin, Griffin son of Maddoc and Ralph le Botiller, to be of counsel and aid to John de Grey, appointed by Edward the king's son to keep the march of Wales between the county of Chester and South Wales and to be captain of his army for the defence of those parts against the Welsh.

Mandate to the wardens of Boston fair to be intendant to Peter de Gisorciis, taker of the king's wines, whom the king is sending there to take his right prise of wines with another 120 tuns.

Protection, at the instance of R. earl of Cornwall, elected king of the Romans, for the burgesses of Lubek in Almain and their goods and merchandize; and exemption of them from all the king's prise, so that nothing shall be taken of their goods to the use of the king or any other, so long as they be of good behaviour to the said Richard.
