PATENTS OF THE FORTY-THIRD YEAR OF KING HENRY SON OF
KING JOHN.

Westminster. Mandate to the mayor and good men of the isle of Oleron. Whereas the king lately committed to Edward his son the said island for his maintenance, on condition that he should not give, lease or alienate it without the king's counsel, and Guy de Lezingnan, the king's brother, in anything but a good way has procured the said Edward to give him the island, for life, by his letters, without the king's assent; by the counsel of the nobles of the council the king revokes this grant and commands them not to be intendant to the said Guy in any way, but to defend it against him and if necessary to apply the rents thereof in the said defence. And the king will shortly send the seneschal into Gascony, to take counsel with them.

Pardon, by the counsel of the nobles of the council, to Master William de Jarum, clerk, of his outlawry for ordering a felony which was committed, it is said, upon Geoffrey son of Walter de Cove, whereof the said Geoffrey appealed him.

Oct. 31. Westminster. Mandate to William de Axemue to give seisin of the abbey of Abbesbury and its possessions to the prior of Abbodesbury, whose election as abbot has been confirmed by E. bishop of Salisbury.

Nov. 2. Westminster. Mandate to John de Crachale, archdeacon of Bedford, appointed by the counsel of the nobles of the king's council to be treasurer, to receive the treasure, rolls, keys and other things pertaining to the said office from Philip Lovel, late treasurer, who is commanded to deliver them to him without delay.

Mandate in pursuance to Philip Lovel.

Nov. 4. Westminster. Grant, by the counsel of the nobles of the council, to John Maunsell treasurer of York, that he may fortify his house of Seggewik, co. Sussex, with ditches and a wall of stone and lime, and crenellate the same.

By the earls of Leicester and Gloucester and others of the council.

Nov. 5. Westminster. Grant, at the instance of Joan, queen of Castile and countess of Ponthieu, to her merchants of Abbeville and the whole county of Ponthieu, that for the present year, throughout the king's whole
