- Dec. 18. Safe conduct until Hilary for the archbishop of Tours and brother  
Woodstock. Velascus, the pope's penitentiary.
- Dec. 18. Collation to the king's chaplain Thomas de Colecestre to the war-  
Woodstock. denship of the house of St. Cross, without Winchester, in the king's  
gift by reason of the voidance of the bishopric of Winchester.  
Mandate to Nicholas de Haudlo, guardian of the bishopric of Win-  
chester, to give him possession.
- Licence for Marmaduke son of Geoffrey to fortify his house of  
Horden, co. Durham, with ditches and a wall of stone, and to  
crenellate the same.
- Dec. 20. Presentation of Wibert de Kancia to the church of Adberbury, in  
Woodstock. the king's gift by reason of the bishopric of Winchester, directed to  
R. bishop of Lincoln.
- Presentation of Simon Passelewe to the church of Petrisfeld, in the  
king's gift as above directed to B. archbishop of Canterbury.  
Afterwards he had a like letter with the chapel of Mapuldorham.
- Dec. 28. Presentation of Master Raymond de Bariamono to the church of  
Windsor. Chyriton, in the king's gift as above; directed to the archbishop.
- Dec. 28. Exemption of John le Pouer, the king's bailiff of Wodestok, so long  
Windsor. as he be in that bailiwick, from suits of counties and hundreds in  
the counties of Oxford and Berkshire.
- Dec. 5. Mandate to the guardian of the bishopric of Durham to restore  
Merton. the temporalities thereof to Robert de Stichehill, prior of Finkehale,  
whose election as bishop has been confirmed by G. archbishop of  
York.  
Writ *de intendendo* to the tenants.
- Dec. 28. Presentation of Richard de Totteford to the church of Burkclere,  
Windsor. in the king's gift by reason of the voidance of the bishopric of Win-  
chester; directed to B. archbishop of Canterbury, or his official in  
the said diocese.
- Presentation of Peter de Wintonia to the church of Waltham, in  
the king's gift as above.
- Presentation of John de Swineford, king's clerk, to the church of  
Westwycumbe in the king's gift as above; directed to R. bishop  
of Lincoln. The king has already presented him, but the bishop  
has hitherto deferred to admit him.
- The prior and convent of St. Swithun's, Winchester, have licence  
to elect; by Ralph Russel, Walter de Oxonia, and Nicholas de  
Merewell, their fellow monks, coming to the king with letters patent  
of their chapter.
- Dec. 28. Licence, after inquisition *ad quod damnum* made by Thomas Gresle,  
Windsor. justice of the forest on this side Trent, for Robert Walerand to assart  
and bring into cultivation a moiety of his wood of Coytemor, which
