- Sept. 24. Windsor. Safe conduct until Easter for Maredduc son of Res and those whom he brings with him to see the king.
- Sept. 28. St. Paul's, London. Licence for the burgesses of Gernemuth to close their town with a wall and ditch so that the town shall remain closed so long as the burgesses remain faithful to the king and his heirs; and grant that there shall be a gaol in the town for the incarceration and keeping of prisoners and malefactors according to law and the custom of the realm.
- Sept. 28. St. Paul's, London. Grant to the bailiffs and good men of Great Yarmouth of murage for six years from Michaelmas, 45 Henry III.
- Sept. 21. Windsor. Quittance, at the instance of the queen, of Salamon le Evesk, Jew of London, for two years from Michaelmas, from all tallage.
- Oct. 2. St. Paul's, London. Grant to Roger le Convers, king's serjeant, that the king will provide for him in wards or escheats to the value of 10*l.* a year, in compensation for the office of keeper of the gate of the priory of St. Swithun, Winchester, which the king lately granted to him for life, but which after inspection of a charter of Peter de Roches, sometime bishop of Winchester, whereby it appeared that the office had been granted by that bishop to Peter Bydun for life, the king restored to the said Peter.
- Oct. 2. St. Paul's, London. Licence, at the instance of James de Alditheleg', for Ankeretta, his niece, to marry William son of Ralph le Botiler.
- Oct. 3. St. Paul's, London. Commitment, during pleasure, to Nicholas de Molis of the castle of Schireburn.  
Mandate to Philip Basset to deliver it to him.
- Oct. 5. St. Paul's, London. Grant to Andrew, canon of Haltren', clerk of Richard, king of the Romans, the king's brother, of the king's grace, if any pertain to him by reason of the voidance of the abbey of Glastonbury by the death of Roger, the late abbot, of a yearly pension from the next abbot (in anticipation of a more ample benefice), as (has hitherto been allowed to the king in the creations of abbots of the realm. - Oct. 8. St. Paul's, London. Promise to Master Arnald de Hoyland, chancellor of Richard king of the Romans, to provide for him in an ecclesiastical benefice of the value of 50 marks a year, as soon as an opportunity occurs.
- Oct. 8. St. Paul's, London. Appointment, during pleasure, of William la Zusche to keep the counties of Surrey and Sussex and the castle of Gildeford.  
Mandate to John de Wauton to deliver the keeping of these to him.

Signification to the archbishop of Canterbury, the see of Winchester being void, of the royal assent to the election of Richard de Cantuaria, subprior of Seleburn, to be prior of that place.

Notification that Agnes, late the wife of Stephen Bauzan, has surrendered to the king, in the name of Edward his son, the castle of Totnes (*Tottonie*) which the said Edward had let to her for a term
