March 14. Grant to Ingram de Percy, and his heirs, to whom the king lately
Windsor. granted 50*l.* yearly of rent which are due to divers, Jews of the realm from many Christians, that if any of these should be not clear or certain whereby they cannot fully receive the said rent, such defect shall be supplied to them in clear and certain rents of the like sort or elsewhere in wards or escheats.

March 13. Presentation of William de Axemue to the church of Bredding,
Windsor. void by the resignation of Henry de Wengham, sometime rector. and in the king's gift by reason of the voidance of the bishopric of Winchester ; directed to the official in the diocese of Winchester,

March 14. Grant to William de Valencia the king's brother, that the king
Windsor. will pay to him, his executors or assigns, at the exchequer of Easter 1263, the 900 marks which were deposited in the abbey of Wautham, and 100 marks of the farm of Corebrigg heretofore granted to him ; which money the king caused to be taken to his use while the said William was beyond seas.

Vacated because the letter was surrendered and cancelled.

March 15. Licence for John Maunsell, treasurer of York, to strengthen
Windsor. (*firmare*) his house of Seggewyk, with ditches and a wall of stone and lime and to crenellate and fortify (*inforciare*) his said house.

March 20. To the provost of Paris. Whereas Reynold de Pontibus and
Windsor. Margaret his wife, by Louis, king of France, sued for the king to be compelled to receive the homage and fealty of the said Reynold in the name of his wife for the land and castle of Gensac, and the king answered in the court of France that he was ready to show justice to the said Reynold and Margaret and also to Ridel de Brigeriaco, who opposes this asserting that he has some right in the said land and castle and suing for his homage to be received by the king and for him to be seized thereof, before the said Reynold and Margaret moved any cause (*questionem*) against the king in the court of the king of France, and to any other persons interested herein ; and whereas the said court of France decreed (*disposuerit*) that the king should fix a day and place for the said Reynold and Margaret in his court of Gascony, to proceed in the premises according to law and the custom of those parts, and signify such day to the said provost, that he may certify the said Reynold and Margaret thereof ; the king fixes a day, one month after Easter at Bordeaux, to proceed in the premises and has given a safe conduct to the said Reynold and Margaret, their goods and the persons whom they bring with them.

Safe conduct for them accordingly.
