March 27. Presentation of Robert de Walmesford to the church of Norburg, Westminster. in the diocese of Lincoln, in the king's gift by reason of the voidance of the abbey of Peterborough.

March 28. Bond to Luke de Batencurt in 48*l.* for 20 tuns of wine; to Philip Westminster. le Tailur in 24*l.* for 10 tuns of wine; and to Raymond Belyn in 33*l.* 12*s.* for 14 tuns of wine; taken from them to the king's use by John de Somersete and William Biset, the king's butlers, as testified of Ebulo de Montibus, the steward; which money the king will pay to them there weeks after Easter.

April 2. Pardon to Thomas de Carleton for the death of Robert le Blund Westminster. of Norwich, as it appears by inquisition made by William de Weland that he is not guilty.

Grant to John Mansell, treasurer of York, of the wardship of the lands late of Alard le Fleming, tenant in chief, with knights' fees, advowsons of churches and dowers when they fall in; to hold to him and his assigns, with the marriage of the heirs.

Mandate to William de Weilond, escheator on this side Trent, to give him seisin of the said wardship.

Grant to him of the marriage of Emma late the wife of the said Alard.

Signification to the bishop of Worcester of the royal assent to the election of Reginald de Hamme, monk of St. Peter's Gloucester, to be abbot of that place.

April 6. Grant to Guy de Leziniaco, in part satisfaction of his grant of a Westminster. wardship of the value of 30*l.* a year with the marriage of the heir, of the wardship of the lands and heirs of Thomas de Gousle, extended at 13*l.* 10*s.* 1*½d.* in the king's gift by reason of the voidance of the bishopric of Salisbury, with the marriage of the heirs.

April 10. Mandate to John le Bel, guardian of the bishopric of Salisbury, [Westminster.] to give seisin of the bishopric to Walter de la Wile, canon of that house, whose election as bishop has been confirmed by B. archbishop of Canterbury.

Writ *de intendendo* to the tenants.

Pardon to Alan le Beltoft for the death of John son of Alan, as it appears by inquisition made by Richard de Hemington that he killed him by misadventure as he could not otherwise escape death.

April 10. The like to John Hogheles for the death of Walter de Chabbeham Westminster. on testimony before the king by Martin de Littlebiry and his fellows justices last in eyre in the county of Surrey, that it was proved before them that he killed him by misadventure.

April 13. Grant to Geoffrey (*sic*) de Leziniaco, to whom the king assigned Westminster. the wardship of the lands and heirs of Thomas de Gousle extended at 13*l.* 10*s.* 1*½d.* [granted above to Guy] in part satisfaction of a wardship of 30*l.* a year, that the king will in full satisfaction thereof cause a wardship of 16*l.* or 17*l.* a year to be assigned to him.
