 March 12. Oxford. Mandate to the chancellor and university of Oxford to retire from Oxford and go home during the king's stay there. By K. & C. [*Fœdera.*]
- March 13. Oxford. Appointment of R. bishop of Coventry and Lichfield, and Master Nicholas de Plumpton, archdeacon of Norfolk, as the king's proctors to seek Simon de Monte Forti, earl of Leicester and the other barons adhering to him, in the presence of John de Valent[inis], knight and envoy of the king of France, upon certain articles and matters to be laid before them from the king by word of mouth.
- March 9. Oxford. Licence for Richard Foliot and his heirs, to enclose his manor of Grimston, co. Nottingham, with a ditch and wall of stone and lime and to fortify and crenellate it.
- March 15. Oxford. Pardon, at the instance of the Friars Preachers of Oxford, to Walter de Esenden of his outlawry for robbery and other trespasses in the county of Kent, whereof he was indicted.
- March 12. Oxford. Licence for life for Ralph de Ginges to hunt with his own dogs the hare, the fox, the cat and the badger in the king's forests in the county of Essex.
- March 15. Oxford. Protection without clause, until Whitsunday, for Margaret de Ferrariis, countess of Derby.
- March 16. Oxford. Licence for Roger de Sumery and his heirs to enclose the dwelling-place of his manor (*mansum manerii sui*) of Duddeleg, co. Stafford, and of Welegh, co. Worcester, with a ditch and a wall of stone and lime, and to fortify and crenellate it.
- March 16. Oxford. Grant to Warin de Bassingeburn of the marriage of the heir of William Maudut of Wermenistre, tenant in chief.

Licence for Robert Aguilun and his heirs to crenellate the dwelling house of his manor of Porting'es', [*rectius* Percinges] co. Sussex, in like manner as above.

Pardon, at the instance of Hugh Saunzaver, to Robert Fichet of Hunnewik for the death of William Snel of Bath.

- March 15. Oxford. Grant to William Belet, after inquisition *ad quod damnum* made by John son of Nigel, keeper of the forest of Bernewode, that he and his heirs shall have reasonable estover in the king's wood of Pidenton within that forest, for his dwelling place at Burstall.
- March 15. Oxford. Assignment to Philip Basset, to whom the king lately committed the castle of Devizes during pleasure, which by reason of the present disturbance of the realm it is now necessary to munition with victuals, of all the issues of the manors of Porlaund and Wike which are in his keeping by the king's commission, to be taken during the keeping for the munition and repair of the said castle; on condition that at the
