Sept. 15. Commitment during pleasure, by the counsel of the barons of the
Canterbury. council, to Humphrey de Bohun the younger of the island of Lynday, with the castle and other appurtenances, so that he answer at the Exchequer for the issues.

Writ *de intendendo* to the tenants.

Mandate to Mauger de Sancto Albino to deliver it to him.

Simple protection without clause until All Saints, for Geoffrey de Nevill.

Sept. 16. Safe conduct for John de Grey, coming with his household, horses,
Canterbury. arms, harness, and things to the king wherever he may be in England, staying and returning; and for his greater security the king has commanded Ralph Basset of Sapecote to conduct him.

Sept. 16. Whereas the king by the counsel of the prelates and magnates,
Canterbury. lately appointed Master Robert de Scardeburg, archdeacon of the East Riding, and John de Raygate to collect and keep the fruits and profits of ecclesiastical benefices of alien and other clerks who are adversaries of the king in the diocese and province of York, and whereas it is now provided by the council that this shall be done by the diocesans and not by others; the king has appointed G. archbishop of York to collect the said fruits in his diocese, and to lay them up in the cathedral church of York in the form provided by the said prelates and barons.

Sept. 17. Grant to the bailiffs, burgesses and other good men of Humphrey de
Canterbury. Bohun the younger of Haverford, at the instance of the said Humphrey their lord, of murage for seven years from the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, 48 Henry III.

[Sept. 17.] Appointment of John de Burgo to make purchases of goshawks
Canterbury. and falcons in the instant fairs of Lenn and Gernemue; with mandate to the wardens and bailiffs of the fairs to be of aid to him.

Simple protection without clause, until Christmas, for the merchants of Flanders dwelling in the realm.

Sept. 18. Commitment by the counsel of the barons of the council, to Guy de
Canterbury. Brien of the castles of Edward the king's son of Kardigan and Kermerdin, to keep during the pleasure of the king and the said Edward, so that he answer for the issues to the king or the said Edward at the king's mandate.

Mandate to Richard de Tunderle, bailiff of Kermerdin, and Roger de Mortuo Mari, constable of Kardigan, to deliver them to him.
