Mandate to John de Balliolo, Peter de Brus, Robert de Nevill, Ralph son of Randolph, William de Craystok, Roger de Lancastre, Stephen de Meynyl, Adam de Gesemuth, Gilbert Haunsard, Eustace de Bayllo, Nicholas de Bolteby and Robert de Stutevill of Aton, to come to the king at London on Sunday after St. Peter's Chains with horses and arms to give their aid and counsel with the rest of the magnates against the invasion of the aliens, and not to delay further as they will avoid the king's indignation. The king lately commanded them by letters patent directed to the commonalties of the counties to come, but they signified that because of grievances which John de Eyvill, John de Vescy, Thomas de Moleton and Gilbert de Unframvill are trying to inflict upon them, they could not come on the day and at the place appointed without serious loss, for which, reason the king has commanded these to desist from such grievances, so that they might come, and many times afterwards has commanded them to come, but they have put off doing so, whereat the king is much moved.

Appointment of Gilbert de Preston to enquire whether Ralph Chadde killed Alan de Lungecat by felony or otherwise. Bedford.

Whereas the king by letters patent lately commanded the archbishops, bishops, earls, barons, knights and free tenants who were sufficient for this to prepare themselves with horses and arms, so as to be with him at London on Sunday after St. Peter's Chains last to go for the common defence against the invasion of aliens with the king towards the sea, and the sheriff of Cambridge and Huntingdon, taking with him the keeper of the peace, to cause to come from every township on the same day eight, six or four of the best footmen with arms, according to the size and power of the township; and from cities, castles and boroughs, horsemen and footmen according to their power
