Charter, granting at the instance of Baldwin, emperor of Constantinopol, the king's kinsman, to his burgesses and merchants of Bernylet that they shall not be distrained in England for any debt whereof they be not chief debtors or sureties or unless the debtors are of their commune and power, having wherewithal to satisfy their creditors and failing to do justice to them. Witnesses as above.

Notification, as the king is perturbed about the injuries, damages and violences lately committed against the church and ecclesiastical persons in the province of Canterbury that the king has promised B. archbishop of Canterbury that he and Hugh le Bygod and Robert Aguyllun will procure that Roger de Clyfford, Roger de Leyburn, John de Vallibus, Ralph Basset of Drayton, John Gyffard, Hamo Lestrangle, Hugh de Turbervill, William de Huntingefeld, and William de Ebroicis, upon whom the blame of these injuries is laid, shall make competent amends before next Sunday, upon which *Letare Jerusalem* is sung. In testimony whereof the king and the said Hugh and Robert have appended their seals to this.

Pardon, at the instance of William le Baud, to Philip de Patemere for the death of John de Otteford and of his consequent outlawry.

Pardon, at the instance of Beatrice the king's daughter, to Walter le Noreys of Tuddeswurth for the death of Reynold son of Robert de Tuddeswurth, chaplain, and of his consequent outlawry.

Notification that the king has compromised on Louis king of France touching the provisions of Oxford and all contentions thereon up to the day of St. Lucy last with the barons of England, promising to observe the oath which John de la Lynde made on his soul that he will observe what the said king shall ordain, on condition that Louis declare his award before Whitsunday. The king wills that the said Louis have full power of decision in all matters treated of in the said compromise, but does not will that by this compromise, anything be derogated from the former compromise made between the king and his barons upon the said Louis.

Protection with clause for Stephen de Croynden, so long as he is with the king in France.

Notification that whereas Louis, king of France, upon whom the king and his barons had compromised touching the Provisions of Oxford, published his award at Amiens on the morrow of St. Vincent the Martyr, and has requested the king to receive to his peace all those of the realm of England who did not append their seals to the said compromise or did not swear to keep the award of the said Louis, as well as those who did append their seals and so swear, and who are willing to come to the king's peace and to swear that they will observe the said award; the king, at the instance of the said Louis, has freely granted this.
