The like to Warin de Bassingburn, for laudable service to the king and Edward his son, of the houses in Bredstrete, within the city of London, late of Thomas son of Thomas, sometime mayor of London.

Simple protection, until Easter, at the instance of Roger de Messinden, for John de Caumpes, parson of the church of Norhale.

The like, until Whitsunday, for Emp'hes' Mort and William de la Puriade, merchants of Cowriz.

Whereas Peter de Petraponte, a constant adherent of the king and Edward his son, was taken in the conflict of Lewes by the king's enemies and kept in the prison of Hugh le Despenser until he made fine by 700 marks with him for his ransom, whercof sundry charters of feoffment and writings obligatory were made between them and delivered to the prior of the Hospital of St. John of Jerusalem in England to keep to the form contained therein; the king for the indemnity of the said Robert (*sic*), commands the prior to deliver the said charters and writings to the said Robert (*sic*), and the king will keep the said prior harmless thereof.

Grant for life, for the saving of the king's soul and the souls of his ancestors and heirs, to Nicholas de Denton, a poor clerk, of that place on Gilbert's Hill belonging to the town of Upton, 100 feet square, by the land which the said Nicholas has of the gift of the abbot and convent of Shrewsbury, to build an oratory there wherein to dwell and attend to divine service.

Simple protection until Easter, at the instance of Roger de Nortwod, for Payn Chaez.

The like until Whitsunday for the master, brethren and sisters of the hospital of St. John, Andovre.

The like for Stephen, parson of the church of Scotteby.

Commitment, during pleasure, to Roger de Lancastre, sheriff of Lancaster, of all the king's demesnes in that county with the stock and other things belonging thereto, so that he answer at the Exchequer for the issues.

Simple protection, until Easter, for Theobald le Butiler.

Oct. 16. Grant to Peter de Chauvent and his heirs of the houses in the Westminster. city of London late of Robert de Montpelers, sometime citizen of London, the king's enemy.

The like to the following of houses late of the king's enemies in the said city:—

Roger de Leyburn, those late of William de Kancia.

William Belet, those late of Thomas Viel, by the hospital of St.

Giles in the suburb of London, with rents within the city pertaining to the said houses.

Robert de Tybetot, those late of Philip le Taylur.

John de Colecestre, almoner and chaplain of the king, those late of William Dible on the Thames near Castle Baynard.
