Safe conduct until the Purification for Robert de Ripairis, steward of Alesia de Lacy, coming to the king.

Simple protection until Easter for Master Gilbert de Millers.

Protection until Midsummer for Thomas Haudwyn, because it has been testified before the king that he was steadfast in his fealty to the king and his son during the late disturbance.

Protection without clause, until Midsummer, for Thomas de Kinros.

The like for one year for Henry Walemund, merchant of the queen.

Nov. 12. Confirmation of a grant which Hugh and John, chaplains, keepers  
Westminster. of the House of Converts, London, and the converts of that place made to Adam de Cestreton, king's clerk and his assigns, for his life, of certain houses and places within the close of the court of their house.

Pardon, at the instance of Philip Marmyun, to Walter son of Thorald de Beningwod for the death of Reiner le Messer of Eysterby, whom he killed by misadventure.

Whereas William de Valencia, the king's brother, during the late disturbance in the realm, in the parts of Pembroke, besieged the castle of Haverford late of Humphrey de Bohun the younger then the king's enemy, and captured it from him; the king has granted to the said William the said castle to hold to him and his heirs during the minority of the daughters of the said Humphrey and heirs of Joan late the wife of the said Humphrey.

Simple protection for one year for Emma de Sancto Johanne.

Safe conduct until the feast of St. Nicholas for Robert de Ferrariis, earl of Derby, coming to the king.

Grant to Robert Walerand of all the chattels of William de Estenoure and the farm of certain land, which the latter had of the prior of St. Martins de Bosco in Hoo; and of the chattels of Gervase and Robert, brothers of the said William, and of Thomas le Waleys, the king's enemies and rebels, wherever these shall be found.

Simple protection until Whitsunday for Thomas de Bosevill and Hugh his brother.

Whereas the king lately granted to Godfrey Giffard the houses with their rents in the parish of St. Stephen between Colemanstrete and Bassishawe, London, late of Cok son of Aaron, a Jew, and the said Godfrey, being in the king's presence, surrendered them to the king; the king, out of reverence for W. bishop of Bath and Wells, has granted them to Alice the bishop's sister.
