Grant to John de Sutton, king's clerk, buyer of the wardrobe, of 20*l.* a year from the wardrobe so long as he be in that office.

Association of Henry de Monte Forti, in the room of Robert de Brywes, to be justice with Nicholas de Turri and the justices on eyre in the county of Norfolk for all pleas.

Simple protection without clause for two years for Master Roger de Herteburn, going to the court of Rome on the affairs of the bishop of Durham.

Grant to Beatrice the king's daughter, consort of John de Britannia, of the wardship of the lands and heirs of John Peyvre, who held in chief, with knights' fees, advowsons of churches and dowers when they fall in.

Whereas the king has granted to the abbot and convent of Seleby that they may use those liberties which they have been prevented from using on account of the late war in the realm ; mandate to justices, sheriffs and others not to molest them contrary to this grant.

Acknowledgment of the payment by the king's order by Clemency late the wife of Robert de Scales who held in chief to Maumoyne, attorney of John de Britannia the king's son, of 100 marks, in part payment of 400 marks, whereby she made fine for the wardship of the lands and heirs of the said Robert.

The like, by the dean and chapter of the king's chapel of St. Mary, Totenhall, to Peter de Wintonia, keeper of the wardrobe, at Windsor, on Wednesday the feast of St. Mark, 52 Henry III, of 40*s.* of the said tenth for the second year in that chapel.

The like, by the dean and chapter of St. Mary's, Stafford, of 66*s.* 8*d.*

The like, by the dean and chapter of the chapel of St. Michael, Pencriz, of 59*s.* 4*d.*

The like by the dean and chapter of Wolvrenehampton of 53*s.* 4*d.*

Pardon to John de Sancto Walerico of the king's indignation and rancour of mind conceived towards him by occasion of any trespasses done by him at the time of the disturbance had in the realm, and pardon of the said trespasses ; provided that he stand his trial if any will proceed against him.

To John le Bretun. Because the king understands that depredations have been committed against the burgesses and good men of Grymesby as well within the town as without [*unfinished*].
