towns of Winchelese and Sandwich in the said time and in crossing the sea and going to the counts of St. Pol and Bolon and for horses lost in those parts; after audit of his account by the treasurer and barons of the Exchequer, as signified to the king under the seal of the Exchequer.

The like to the same in 500*l.* for the lands which Alina late the wife of William le Mareschal, lately deceased, held in dower of her said husband's lands and the said Roger had by grant of the king according to the form of the award of Kenilworth and surrendered to the use of John de Britannia the king's son.

Grant to him, in part compensation of his said expenses and of his said surrender, of the marriage of the heirs of Walter de Molesceye, and of the year, day and waste of the lands of Henry de Sancto Mauro with his chattels if he be convicted of the felony charged against him; saving to Nicholas de Kugenho 40 marks of the said year day and waste previously granted to him; so that the value of these grants, as found by inquisition, be deducted from the said sum wherein the king is bound to him.

Aug. 16. Grant to him, in part payment of the said debt, of the manor of  
Lincoln. Bradeleye late of Robert Russel, detained in prison for the death of a man unknown, if he be convicted; to hold to him and his heirs.

Aug. 18. Pardon, at the instance of William Belet, to Nicholas son of  
Lincoln. Nicholas de Ponte of Wygehale for the death of John Stalwrthman of Sudlham; as the king is informed by the record of the rolls of Nicholas de Turri and his fellows, justices lately in eyre in the county of Norfolk, that he killed him in self defence.

Exemption during pleasure, at the instance of brother John de Derlington, of Thomas de Wodehay, king's servant, and his tenants from paying murage on goods going for sale to the town of Grimesby; with mandate, to the mayor, bailiffs and good men not to molest them contrary to this grant.

Request to the abbot and convent of Waltham to deliver to Walter de London, monk of Westminster, 100 marks of the tenth granted by the pope of their ecclesiastical benefices, to redeem the king's precious jewels pawned beyond seas, as the king has no money in hand for this.

Simple protection, without clause, for one year, for Cecily de Ardern.

The like for the abbot and convent of St. Doghmal.

Grant to Geoffrey Gocelin and his heirs of the manor of Roudon, held in chief by Henry de Sancto Mauro, who has fled for his felony in killing Adam de Lydeierd; if the said Henry be convicted of the felony.

*Inspeximus* and confirmation of letters patent of Queen Eleanor, dated at Westminster, 25 May, 57 (*sic*) Henry III, whereby she grants to Joan Luvet late the wife of Henry Luvet of the following dower out of the lands of the said Henry, the wardship of the lands
