March 13. Exemption for life of Philip de Grindham from being put on assizes, Westminster. juries or recognitions, and from being made sheriff, &c., against his will.

March 14. Grant, at the instance of M. queen of Scotland, the king's daughter, [Westminster.] to Thomas de Kynros, king's clerk, of the ransom pertaining to the king of the lands of John de Stoke in the county of Northampton by occasion of his trespasses in the time of the disturbance ; to hold in the form of the award of Kenilworth.

March 20. Acknowledgment that Master Robert de Purlegh, king's clerk, Westminster. collector of the tenth granted by the pope in the bishopric of Chichester, delivered in the wardrobe by order of the king to Peter de Wintonia, keeper of that wardrobe, on Wednesday the feast of St. Cuthbert, 53 Henry III, 1331. 6s. 8d. of the said tenth, of which the king acquits him.

March 20. Whereas the king heretofore, at the instance of Queen Eleanor, Westminster. granted to Pernell late the wife of John le Flemmeng of Southampton, that all those persons who in her lifetime by her licence and will, should sojourn or be lodged in the capital mansions (*capitalibus mansionibus*) late of Ralph Isambard and in those late of Walter le Flemmeng in Southampton for carrying on and selling merchandise, should be quit of the payment of murage in the town of Southampton, by land or water, so long as they sojourned or were lodged therein ; and whereas the king further granted to her that all merchants of Bruges in Flanders sojourning or lodging in the said mansions or any house thereof, should not be named or distrained in the said town for any debt whereof they are not principal debtors or sureties ; grant, at the instance of the queen, to the said Pernell of further grace that she shall be quit for her life of payment of murage in the said town of Southampton and that her goods shall not be named or distrained for any debt whereof she is not principal debtor or surety.

Pardon, out of reverence for St. Edward, and at the instance of Master Henry Wade, king's serjeant, to Adam son of Peter de Cosham of the king's suit for the death of Alan Wlfard and of any consequent outlawry.

March 23. Exemption for life at the instance of Robert Aguilon, of Adam de Westminster. Cokefeld from being put on assizes, juries or recognitions, and from being made sheriff, &c. against his will.
