Grant to John de Beaumes, yeoman of Eleanor, consort of Edward the king's son, for bringing the good news of the birth of her daughter Eleanor, that the king will provide for him 10*l.* or 10 marks at least yearly of land out of wards or escheats.

Pardon, at the instance of Guy de Leziniaco, the king's brother, to Henry Wyngar' for the death of Richard son of Richard Gocelyn of Knythton and of any consequent outlawry.

Simple protection for one year for Henry Jordani of Notingham.

Grant to John de Beaumes above, repeated.

Exemption for seven years, at the instance of Robert de Brywes of Thomas de Honneby from being put on assizes, juries or recognitions, and from being made sheriff &c. against his will.

Protection for two years for the church of Henry de Mersinton of Braundonferie, and for his men and goods there.

June 25. Grant to Hereward de Mariscis, for his good service and to Alice
Winchester. la Bele of Winchester, his wife, for many courtesies and honours which she has done as well to the king as the queen, that their carts or horses shall not be taken by stewards, marshals, sheriffs or other ministers for carriage of wines to the king's use, or other carriage, against their will.

Presentation of John de Bles', chaplain to the church of Wyllingham, directed to the bishop of Norwich.

Protection for one year for John de Stokes, vicar of the church of Codeham.

July 3. Acknowledgment that the prior of Leministre, collector of the
Westminster. tenth granted by the pope in the bishopric of Hereford has delivered in the wardrobe to Peter de Wintonia, keeper of that wardrobe, on Wednesday after SS. Peter and Paul, 53 Henry III, 30*l.* of the said tenth.

July 4. Simple protection for two years for the master and brethren of the
Westminster. hospital of St. Bartholomew, London.

July 4. Grant to the abbess and convent of Godestowe, for a fine of 10*l.*
Westminster. whereof the king has pardoned them 5 marks, that upon the next voidance by the cession or death of Emma, the present abbess, the prioress and convent shall have the keeping of the abbey, for this time.

Exemption for life of Oliver Morel from being put on assizes, juries or recognitions, and from being made sheriff &c. against his will.

July 5. Acknowledgment that N. bishop of Winchester, has delivered in
Westminster. the wardrobe to Peter de Wintonia, keeper of that wardrobe, on Friday the eve of the Apostles Peter and Paul, at Guldeford, 53 Henry III, by the hand of Walter de Uppeham clerk, 100*l.* of the tenth of his bishopric.
