Mandate to Edward the king's son to give seisin of the temporalities of the archbishopric of Bordeaux, which were taken into the king's hands by reason of the voidance of the see to B., archbishop of Bordeaux, who lately came to the king to have restitution of these and the king has graciously admitted. *Et sunt patentes.*

In like manner it is commanded to John de la Linde, seneschal of the Limousin, Quercy and Périgord, to give him seisin of all the possessions and castles, which in the time of the said voidance were in the king's hands, to wit of the castles of Bigarroque, Belvès (*de Bello Videre*), Millac (*de Millaco*), Couse (*de Cosa*), La Mothe-Montravel (*de Monte Revel*), and the motte of St. Paixent, with the boroughs, manors and appurtenances thereof. *Et sunt patentes.*

Protection with clause, so long as he is in the king's service, for William Bonquer who is with the king in the parts of France.

The like for William de Berewik, who is with the said William Bonquer in France.

Aug. 16. Licence for Robert de Twenge, the king's household knight, to
St. Germain crenellate his house of Bergh, co. York.

Aug. 16. Presentation of Nicholas de Villa to the church of Melebroc Prioris ;
St. Germain directed to the archbishop of Canterbury and his official in the
des Prés. bishopric of Winchester during the voidance of the see.

Aug. 15. Pardon to William de Welegh of the king's suit for the death of
St. Germain Nicholas and of his flight on account of the said death ; as it appears
des Prés. by inquisition made by Geoffrey de Leukenor and Richard de Hemminton that he killed him in self defence.

Mandate to the sheriff and the coroners of the county of Gloucester to cause all the goods of the said William which were taken into the king's hands on account of his flight, to be replevied to him, to answer thereof as he ought according to law and the custom of the realm.

Aug. 18. Charter, granting, at the instance of Queen Eleanor, to Richard de
St. Germain Ewel, king's serjeant, for his homage and service, all that land in
des Prés. Farnham which Ralph Haket held sometime of the king's bail, and which came to the king's hands as an escheat of the lands of the count of St. Pol in England ; which land the king had lately granted by charter to Stephen de Salines, knight, and his heirs, and Gerard de Salines, brother and heir of the said Stephen, afterwards quit-claimed to the king to the use of the said Richard : to hold to him, his heirs and assigns at a rent of a pair of gilt spurs at the Exchequer on Michaelmas or of 6*d.* for all service, until the king or his heirs restore it to the right heirs of his own will or by a peace, in either of which cases the king will not disseise him until he has made him a reasonable exchange. Witnesses :—As last mentioned, with the omission of Ingram de Fednes, and the addition of Imbert de Muntferaunt.
