Westminster. Whereas Thomas, late duke of Norfolk, deceased, after his marriage with his wife Elizabeth, who still survives, enfeoffed the king by the name of Henry, earl of Derby, and others of the manors of Weston and Alkombury, co. Huntingdon, Lincelade and Southcote, co. Buckingham, Kyngton, co. Warwick, and Hynton, co. Cambridge, and certain lands in Ikelyngton, co. Cambridge, certain lands in Stretton in the Strete, co. Rutland, and 2ls. rent in the town of Northampton for the fulfilment of certain conditions agreed upon between him and the earl of Huntingdon, likewise decreed concerning the marriage of Thomas son of the duke, and Catherine daughter of the king grandfather of the said Elizabeth, that she have her dower from the premises notwithstanding his estate therein. Westminster. *Inspecimus* and confirmation to Thomas de Bardolf, knight and heir of Roger Damory, and the heirs of his body of letters patent dated 12 August, 13 Edw. II. of Roger and the heirs of his body 100 marks of silver to be received by them or their heirs or assigns in the next year next ensuing until they shall be provided with lands to the value of the same, being made for any such partial provision. June 2.
Westminster. Grant to Thomas de Wydenhale of the office of yeoman of the king's cars, receiving 3*d.* daily for life at the Exchequer. By K.

Westminster. Protection given for one year, for John Acton, clerk, staying on the king's service in the company of the king's knight John Stanley, lieutenant of Ireland, on the whole body of that land. By bill of p.s.

Westminster. Appointment, during absence, of John Prestecote as steward of all lordships, manors, lands, tithes, leets and hundreds in the county of Devon late of Thomas, late earl of Kent, John, late earl of Huntingdon, John, late earl of Salisbury, Ralph de Lannley, 'chivaler,' Thomas Blount, 'chivaler,' and Benedict de Lannley, 'chivaler,' deceased, who made forfeiture to the king, receiving the accustomed fees. Westminster. *Inspecimus* and confirmation to John de Lancastre and Marjory his wife of letters patent (*French*) of Thomas, duke of Norfolk, earl of Nottingham, lord of Moubray and Segrave, dated at Coventry, 11 September, 22 Richard II. granting to them for life a yearly rent of 20 marks from his manor of Wyke. By p.s. and for 10s. paid in the hanaper.

May 25.
Westminster. Grant for life to the king's uncle Robert Herbotell of the town of Malkarston in Tenedale, which Nicholas de Rothom, deceased, had of the grant of Richard II. By p.s.

May 25.
Westminster. Pardon to Luke Graward for all treasons and felonies committed by him before the Annunciation last, except murder, rape, common breeny and homicide. By p.s.

May 22.
Westminster. Grant for life to John Aldelyne the elder of 40*l.* yearly at the Exchequer in recompense of the offices of excheator, clerk of the market and keeper of the scales and measures in Ireland, granted to him for life by letters patent of Richard II. surrendered; in consideration of the great expenses which he incurred for the redemption of Thomas Clifford, 'chivaler,' to whom the offices were formerly granted for life by Richard II, and because he has been removed from them by pretext of letters patent of the king granting them to Ralph St. John of the county of Lancaster for life.
