voyage in the south sea before 'le Forlond' of Beauchief by Pevense it was taken by certain Frenchmen in a French ship, who took from it its pilot, an Englishman, and all the goods of the English in it and permitted the said Peter to go where he pleased with it, and afterwards John Knolles, Thomas Knolles, William Tot, William Edwyn, Longe Robyn and John Edward of the town of Bourne by Pevense with other accomplices in divers boats captured it and took it away at their will.

Feb. 28. Appointment of Peter de Courtenay, 'chivaler,' John Wadham, Westminster. 'chivaler,' William Stourton, Robert Hull the younger, John Manyngford, Thomas Bowet and John Stourton as justices for the supervision of the river of the water of Avene between the city of Bath and the town of Bristol pursuant to the statutes of 25 and 45 Edward III and 1 Henry IV concerning the erection of weirs, mills, stanks, pales and kiddles.

March 15. Commission to the king's kinsman Edmund, earl of Kent, Richard Westminster. Seymour, 'chivaler,' Humphrey Stafford, 'chivaler,' Thomas Brook, 'chivaler,' John Devereux, 'chivaler,' John Frome, Morgan Gogh, John Bache, William Grene, Thomas Dacombe, John Savage, Henry Strode, John Fauntleroy, Robert Grey and Robert Leddrede and John Drax and Robert Saperton, serjeants at arms, to make proclamation at the town of Lutton, in the diocese of Salisbury, and elsewhere if necessary forbidding any persons from prosecuting appeals in derogation of the king's right in the church of Lutton or of the possession of that church by the king's clerk John Frank, presented to it by the king and duly admitted, instituted and inducted, and to arrest and imprison all who after such proclamation and inhibition disregard the same. Jan. 22. Commission to John Hull, esquire, on complaint by Ouehea Evans of Westminster. Servano, master of a barge called *Scint John* of Vermew in the kingdom of the king of Castile, that on 19 October last John Haweley and Thomas Norton and other lieges of the king of a fleet of ships of the towns of Dertemuth, Bristol and Plymmouth captured the said barge laden with goods of avoirdupois of merchants of Plesancia, Pemond and Navarre at sea contrary to the form of the present truce and took it to the port of Dertemuth, to cause restitution to be made of the barge with all its gear and the freight amounting to 787 crowns of gold and 125 quintals of iron of Spain, 250 dozen goatskins and 70 ox-hides with the goods of the said Ouehea and his mariners and their costs, and to order all the king's lieges opposing the execution of this mandate to appear in person before the council at Westminster before St. Gregory the Pope next. The like to the same, on like complaint by Perodies de Gane, master of a ship called *Scinte Marie* of Presence in the kingdom of the king of Castile, of the portage of 170 tuns, with freight amounting to 1,332 crowns of gold and two tuns of wine and armour and goods of himself and his mariners amounting to 400 crowns of gold.

Feb. 17. The like to the same, on like complaint by John Ocho, master of a Westminster. ship called *St. Peter* of Presence, of the portage of 108 tuns, with freight amounting to 807 crowns of gold and goods and armour of himself and his mariners amounting to 200 crowns of gold. By K.
