Worcester. *Inspecimus* and confirmation of letters patent (*French*) of Thomas, earl Marshal and of Nottingham, lord of Moubray, Segrave and Gower, dated at his castle of Chepstowe, 25 July, 5 Henry IV, granting for life to his esquire John Wilcotes an annuity of 20*l.*, viz. 15*l.* from the issues of his manor of Northpidyll, co. Worcester, and 5*l.* from the issues of his manor of Thorlaston on Donsmore, co. Warwick.

Worcester. Grant for life to the king's knight John Tiptoft of 20*l.* yearly from the fee-farm and issues of the city of Norwich and a tun of wine of Gascony yearly in the port of Ipswich; in lieu of like grants to George Felbrigge by letters patent, surrendered.

1. A charter dated at Ghent, 11 February, 14 Edward III, granting to John Avenel that he and his heirs shall have free warren in all their demesne lands of Gamelgie, Toft, Mordon and Wypole, co. Cambridge, provided that these are not within the metes of the forest.
