March 19. Licence for the king's esquire Thomas Wykeham to crenellate the
Westminster. mansion of his manor of Broghton. By K.

March 22. Licence, for 10 marks paid in the hanaper by Thomas Chippenham,
Westminster. citizen of Hereford, for the alienation in mortmain by him of a messuage
in Hereford and by Richard Luggore and John Odiskyn of two shops in
the same city, held of the king in burgage as parcel of the city, to a
chaplain to celebrate divine service daily at the altar of Holy Trinity in
the parish church of St. Peter, Hereford, for their good estate and for
their souls after death and the souls of their parents and benefactors.

Licence, for 20 marks paid to the king by John Falk the elder, John
Odiskyn, chaplain, and Richard Clyfford, chaplain, for them to grant in
mortmain three messuages in Hereford, held of the king in burgage as
parcel of the city, to a chaplain to celebrate divine service daily for the
souls of John Fromward and his father and mother and ancestors in the
church of St. Peter, Hereford.

March 20. Whereas the pope has made a provision to Richard Shebourne,
Westminster. chaplain, of the vicarage of the parish church of St. Stephen, Saltassh,
in the diocese of Exeter, the king pardons the trespasses in this and
grants licence for the said Richard to accept and take possession of the
vicarage. By p.s.

March 25. Grant to the king's knight Walter Hungerford, in consideration of his
Westminster. great charges on the king's service before this time and especially lately
at the town of Calais, where he had to do with a knight of France to the
honour of the king and the realm in arms, of 100 marks due to the king
from an annuity of 100 marks which the king's knight John Aysshle
receives from the king for life at the hands of the constable and farmers
of the castle and town of Marleburgh by cause of the resumption of the
same into the king's hands by virtue of the Parliament lately held at
Coventre. [*Fadera.*] By p.s.

March 24. Pardon to Katharine late the wife of John, lord of Beaumont, and
Westminster. executrix of his will and her heirs, executors and tenants of 72*l.* demanded
at the Exchequer from an instalment of a greater sum demanded from
her husband on the remainder of his account of the receipts and wages
of himself and his men at arms and archers dwelling with him on the
safe-custody of the castle and town of Carlisle and the west marches of
Scotland. By K.

March 28. Presentation of Thomas Dounham to the church of Whytford, in the
Westminster. diocese of St. Asaph.

March 24. Presentation of Matthew West, chaplain, to the church of Pennegos, in
Westminster. the diocese of St. Asaph.

March 31. Presentation of Roger de Radeelyf to the church of Wyleye, in the
Westminster. diocese of London, in the king's gift by reason of the temporalities of the
bishopric being in his hands.

March 30. John, prior of St. Mary's, Lanthony by Gloucester, staying in England,
Westminster. has letters nominating Thomas Spencer and Richard Calne, his fellow
canons, his attorneys in Ireland for three years.

The abbot of Wynchecombe received the attorneys by writ until
the arrival of the nominator to Ireland.
