Oct. 23. *Inspeximus* and confirmation to the Friars Minors of Dunwich of
Westminster. letters patent dated 23 October, 2 Edward III, granting licence for
them to retain a plot of land in Dunwich.
For $\frac{1}{2}$ mark paid in the hanaper.
- Oct. 26. Revocation of letters patent granting the keeping of the gaol of
Westminster. Warwick to Thomas Medewey. At the suit of Richard Ferour, com-
plaining that he had the keeping for life by letters patent dated 4
February, 3 Richard II, until the vigil of St. James the Apostle, 23
Richard II, on which day he was unduly expelled by John Tollas,
but was hindered by the king's said letters patent, the king directed
the sheriff of Warwick to summon the said Thomas to appear before
him in Chancery at a certain day now past to show cause why the
letters should not be revoked, and the sheriff returned that he sum-
moned him by John Weston, Roger Wotton, Thomas Vyncent and
William Hathewyk, but he did not appear and judgement was given
against him.
- Oct. 27. Presentation of Thomas Waryn to the vicarage of the church of
Westminster. Hurst Perpount, in the diocese of Chichester.
- Oct. 27. Pardon to Richard, bishop of London, of the escape from his cus-
Westminster. tody of John Houton, esquire, John Gargrave, Robert Steroppe, and
Richard Barre, convicted clerks, as they were incontinently recaptured
and are now in his custody. By p.s.
- Oct. 30. Pardon to William Spicer of Orford of his outlawry in the county
Westminster. of Suffolk for not appearing before the justices of the Bench to
satisfy the king for his ransom for a trespass committed against Isabel,
countess of Suffolk, against the peace of Richard II. ; he having
surrendered to the Flete prison and satisfied the countess of the
damages adjudged to her, as William Thirnyng, chief justice of the
Bench, has certified.
- Oct. 2. Grant for life to William Messyn, in furtherance of a grant to him
Westminster. on 13 August last (*see Vol. III. p. 465*), of the messuage, 60 acres
of land and $2\frac{1}{2}$ acres of wood there mentioned with 52 acres of land in
the same town of Gamelyngey, co. Cambridge, which the said Robert
Belknapp held and which are in the king's hands by reason of the
judgement against him and for which the king was answered for 25s.
yearly at the Exchequer, to hold altogether to the value of 100s.

- Nov. 5. Commission, during pleasure, to Thomas Hebcastell of the office
Westminster. of the tronage and pesage in the port of Chichester and all ports and
places adjacent, receiving the accustomed fee.
