- Nov. 28. Commission, by mainprise of John Knyghtley of the county of
Westminster. Stafford the elder and William Everdon of the same county, to John
Knyghtley the younger of the keeping of all lands late of William de
Peyto, deceased, tenant in chief, during the minority of William his
son and heir with the marriage of the latter without disparagement,
and so from heir to heir, rendering to the king 40 marks at the Ex-
chequer, maintaining the houses and buildings, supporting all charges
and finding a competent maintenance for the heir.

- Nov. 12. Presentation of Nicholas Grave, chaplain, to the church of West
Westminster. Tyllebury, in the diocese of London. By p.s.
- Dec. 4. Pardon to Hugh Philipson for all trespasses and felonies committed
Westminster. by him, except murder and rape. By p.s.
- Dec. 3. Pardon to William Gudybour of Newcastle on Tyne for all felonies,
Westminster. misprisions, murders and trespasses committed by him, except treason
and rape. By p.s.
- Dec. 1. Pardon to William Silkoke for the death of Robert Getonson in 9
Westminster. Henry IV. By p.s.
- Oct. 28. Admission of Thomas Broune (*as on p. 40*). By p.s.
Westminster.
- Nov. 14. Grant for life to the king's esquires Simon Flete and John Swelle
Westminster. of the office of parker of the king's park of Langele, co. Kent, with
the fees and wages belonging to it; in lieu of a like grant to the said
John by letters patent, surrendered. By p.s.
- Dec. 23. Presentation of John Overton, chaplain, to the church of St. Giles,
Westminster. Wynchelsey, in the diocese of Chichester.
- Nov. 22. Grant for life to the king's clerks of the office of the privy seal
Westminster. John Welde and Richard Priour of certain acres of land lying in the
parishes of Craumfeld, Shutlyngdon, Barton en le Clay, Flittewyk,
Gravenhurst and Sutton, co. Bedford, which came to Edward III.
as escheat and do not exceed the value of 4 marks yearly, as Thomas
Fauconer had while he lived. By p.s.
- Oct. 15. Pardon to Thomas Biriton *alias* Beriton, esquire, for all treasons,
Westminster. insurrections, rebellions, appeals, concealments, felonies, trespasses,
forfeitures, misprisions, conspiracies, confederacies, contempts and
offences against the king's majesty concealed, committed or spoken
by him, except murder, rape and common larceny. By p.s.

- Jan. 13. Grant for life to the king's esquire John Phelippes of two tuns of
Westminster. wine yearly from the king's prise of wines within the port of Bristol.
By p.s.
- Jan. 10. Grant for life to Henry Grene, *alias* Leicestre king of arms, and
Westminster. Elizabeth his wife that they shall have an inn of theirs in the town
of Hertford free from harbouring or lodging by the king's harbingers
or other ministers against their will. By p.s.
