Dec. 10. Grant for life to the king's servant John Ayscow of the king's  
Westminster. cellar of 100s. yearly at the Exchequer. By p.s.
1409.  
Jan. 17. Revocation of the protection with clause *volumus*, for one year,  
Westminster. granted on 29 October last by letters patent to John Kneseworth,  
citizen and goldsmith of London, going on the king's service to the  
parts of Picardy in the company of the king's brother John, earl of  
Somerset, captain of the town of Calais, on the safe-keeping of the  
town, because he delays in the city of London, as Thomas Duke and  
William Norton, sheriffs, have certified.
- Jan. 9. Grant for life to the king's esquire Richard Wydevyle and Joan  
Westminster. his wife of all the king's tenements in the town of Calais lying between  
the tenement of John Mulso on one side towards the north and the  
inn of the king's son the prince on the other side towards the south  
and the mansion of the Friars Carmelite towards the west and the  
tenement of John Strete atte Lane towards the east, which John  
Steward, deceased, had of the king's grant, to the value of 20 marks  
yearly, so that he answer for any surplus at the Exchequer, not-  
withstanding that he has of the king's grant 80 marks yearly at the  
hands of the receiver general of the duchy of Lancaster. By p.s.

Dec. 31. Pardon to Peter Braunche, late parson of the church of Stocton,  
Westminster. for all felonies and trespasses committed by him, except murder,

Westminster. treasons, insurrections, rebellions, misprisions and offences committed

Dec. 1. Pardon to John de Faryngton son of Nicholas de Faryngton of  
Westminster. Mellyng, co. Lancaster, for all treasons, felonies, trespasses, misprisions  
and contempts committed by him, except murder, rape and common  
larceny. By p.s.
- Dec. 4. Pardon to Hugh Philipson (*as on p. 42*).  
Westminster. *Vacated because elsewhere in this year.* By p.s.
- Dec. 7. Grant for life to the king's esquire Adam Bell of 4*l.* 10s. yearly from  
Westminster. the fee-farm of Klypston in Shirwode, co. Nottingham, and the profits  
and commodities from the vesture and herbage of a garden called  
'le Halgarth,' in which the manor of Klypston is situated, to the  
value of 3s. 4*d.* yearly, provided that he answer for any surplus.

- Dec. 3. Pardon to William Kyrkeby for having received John Ryvell,  
Westminster. 'taillour,' knowing that the latter had robbed him of divers cloths  
and other goods. By p.s.
- Dec. 5. Pardon to Alan Zarewych of the county of York for all treasons,  
Westminster. rebellions, insurrections and trespasses committed by him. By p.s.  
The like to Robert son of Alan Zarewyth of the county of York.  
By the same writ.
