Jan. 28. Revocation of letters patent granting to Alesia late the wife of
Westminster. William Deyncourt the keeping of the body of William Deyncourt
son and heir of John Deyncourte, 'chivaler,' and all his lands during
minority, so far as concerns the third part of the town of Rothemerch
with appurtenances in Overhalk and Netherhalk, co. York. By an
inquisition taken before Thomas de Pykeryng, late escheator in the
county, it was found that the said John held the said third part of
the king in chief by knight-service, worth 6*l.* yearly, and nothing
more in the said county, and died on 11 May, 7 Henry IV, and that
the said William was his heir and a minor; and afterwards at the
suit of the chapter of the collegiate church of St. Mary, Suthwell,
showing that although they had been in possession of the said third
part by the name of 15 messuages, 6 tofts, 20 bovates of land, 40
acres of meadow, 200 acres of wood, 100 acres of pasture, 16*s.* 8*d.*
rent and a rent of a pound of pepper in Raumersshe, Netherhalgh
and Overhalgh, co. York, by virtue of a grant of Thomas de Herdewik,
clerk, and others by the king's licence, nevertheless they were ex-
pelled by colour of the said inquisition, the king directed the sheriff
to summon the said Alesia to appear in Chancery at a certain day
now past to show cause why the letters should not be revoked as above,
and he returned that he summoned her by William de Foston, Richard
Kervor, Thomas de Willesthorpe and Thomas Marschall, but she did
not appear and judgement was given against her.

Dec. 1. Licence for the prior and convent of Christchurch, Canterbury, to
Westminster. grant a close and a garden called 'Halton' with 'forstall' of Halton
called 'Halton Grene,' 20 acres of land, 2 acres of meadow, 14 acres
of pasture and 'broke' and 10*s.* 1½*d.* rent and a rent of 18 hens in
Godmersham and Beltyng, co. Kent, held of the king in chief as
parcel of the foundation of the priory by the king's progenitors the
kings of England, to William Darell, Thomas Elys and William Ledes
and their heirs and assigns at a rent of 60*s.* 4*d.* yearly. By p.s.

Feb. 6. Grant for life to John Clerk, one of the clerks of the crown of
Westminster. Chancery, of 20*l.* yearly from the issues of the hanaper; in lieu of a
like grant to him of 10*l.* yearly by letters patent of Richard II, con-
firmed by letters patent of the king, surrendered. By K.
