April 18. Pardon to William Hande the younger for the death of Philip
Westminster. Palmere of Shathewell on Tuesday before St. Luke the Evangelist,
8 Henry IV, at Shathewell. By K.

April 13. Pardon to Robert Shirwynd, sometime mercer of London, deceased,
Westminster. and Richard Style of the sum of 293*l.* 19*s.* 9¼*d.* due to the king, of
which the king lately by letters patent (*see Vol. III. p. 343*) granted
to the said Robert payment of instalments of 20 marks yearly; in
consideration of the great loss which the said Robert sustained by bad
debts in this and for certain other causes. By p.s.

March 24. Grant for life to the king's servitor Henry Plant, one of the king's
York. yeomen porters, of a messuage, 100 acres of land, 10 acres of meadow
and wood and 10*s.* rent in Thorplond and Althorpe by Estbersham
and Snoryng, co. Norfolk, which were lately bequeathed by one Roger
Lynne for amortization to the use of a chaplain and have come into
the king's hands as escheat because one John Cook of Fakenham
occupied them to his own use and not to the use of a chaplain for
ten years and more and received the profits without the king's licence
or amortization, to hold from Monday after St. Matthias, 9 Henry
IV. The premises do not exceed the value of 100*s.* yearly and are
extended at 5 marks yearly by an inquisition taken before the
escheator on the said Monday. By p.s.

April 16. Pardon to Thomas Denny son of Robert Denny, 'chivaler,' indicted
Westminster. and appealed by Isabel Clipston late the wife of William Clipston,
esquire, of having with others on Tuesday before the Nativity of St.
Mary, 8 Henry IV, at Berkelowe in a field called 'Chirchebrede,'
co. Cambridge, lain in ambush to murder the said William and waiting
his advent there struck him on the left part of the head with a sword
worth 12*d.* and given him a mortal blow from which he died. By p.s.

April 27. Revocation of the protection with clause *volumus*, for one year,
Westminster. granted on 12 January last by letters patent to John Sampson, going
on the king's service to Picardy in the company of the king's brother
John, earl of Somerset, captain of the town of Calais, because he
delays in the city of London, as the sheriffs have certified.

April 29. Pardon to John Ryle, 'soudeour,' for all treasons, felonies and
Westminster. trespasses committed by him and for the murder of William Clypston
at Berkelowe, co. Cambridge, on Tuesday before the Nativity of St.
Mary, 8 Henry IV. By p.s.

Feb. 21. Pardon to William Alkokes of Longnorle, indicted of having on
Westminster. Saturday after the Translation of St. Thomas the Martyr, 8 Henry
IV, come by night to the rectory of the church of Corley and in a
house of the rectory killed one David servant of William Seint
George, parson of the church of Corley, with a dagger and hidden
him under his bed there. By p.s.
