June 20. Commission to Henry Ware, clerk, John Kyngton, clerk, Richard Westminster. Brynkle, clerk, Thomas Felde, clerk, John Ovyngham, clerk, William Lisle, 'chivaler,' William Faryngdon, 'chivaler,' Richard Whityngton, citizen of London, William Askham, citizen of London, John Sproxton, clerk, and Robert Esbache, clerk, to hear and determine an appeal by John Brikston against a decision of Henry Bole, lieutenant of Thomas Beaufort, knight, admiral of England and Ireland, in a maritime case concerning the capture of a ship called *la Trinite* of Bayonne and divers goods in it worth 100*l.* between the said John, plaintiff, and one John Calon of the isle of Baas in Brittany in the court of Admiralty.

June 19. Writ of aid for the abbot of Cerne, whom Robert, bishop of Salisbury, Westminster. lately appointed to collect the second and third moieties of the tenth and half [a tenth] last granted to the king by the clergy of the province of Canterbury in the archdeaconry of Dorset and pay the same to the king at All Saints and Easter last, so that nothing be exacted from the benefices of the poor nuns of Tarent, as although he has satisfied the king of the whole sum divers persons, both religious and secular, refuse to pay.

June 20. Exemplification, at the request of the prior and convent of St. Westminster. Denis by Suthampton, of the tenour of the enrolment of letters patent dated 30 December, 14 Edward II. [*Calendar*. 1317-1321. p. 535.]

May 18. Ratification of the estate which the prior and convent of Bus- Westminster. tlesham have in the church of Estclaydon. They obtained possession of the advowson with licence for appropriation by virtue of letters patent dated 20 February, 45 Edward III, and subsequently pope Urban VI united the church to them and their monastery by bull, and on the death of Robert, last parson, who was incumbent at the time of the bull, they took possession of the church and hold it with the assent of the diocesan and archdeacon.

June 25. Pardon to Thomas Lok *alias* Lokke of Chiltenham, co. Gloucester, Westminster. for all felonies, trespasses, forfeitures and misprisions committed by him, except treason, murder and rape. By p.s.

May 20. *Inspeximus* and confirmation to the good men of the marsh of Westminster. Romeneye of letters patent dated 17 January, 14 Richard II, inspecting and confirming with additions letters patent dated 28 November, 7 Edward [II]. For 40*s.* paid in the hanaper.

June 14. Revocation of letters patent dated 24 October last granting Westminster. protection with clause *volumus*, for one year, to Robert Grey going on the king's service to the parts of Picardy in the company of the king's brother John, earl of Somerset, captain of the town of Calais, on the safe-keeping of the town, because he delays in the city of London, as the sheriffs have certified.

June 5. Release to William de Roos of Hamelake of 1000*l.* out of 2000*l.* Westminster. due from him to the king in accordance with a grant by letters patent (see p. 76). By p.s.
