June 20. Westminster. Mandate to Thomas Boteller, prior of St. John of Jerusalem in Ireland, whom the king's son Thomas de Lancastre, steward of England, appointed lieutenant of Ireland by letters patent on 1 March, 7 Henry IV, for twelve years, has appointed as his deputy from 1 June last during the king's pleasure, to attend to the premises in the absence of the said lieutenant.

June 28. Westminster. Pardon to John Restaurek *alias* Restourek the younger, son of William Restaurek of the county of Cornwall, for all appeals impeachments, murders, felonies, concealments, trespasses, forfeitures, misprisions, conspiracies, contempts and offences committed by him against the king's royal majesty. By K.

Presentation of Nicholas James, vicar of the church of Bolton, in the diocese of York, to the church of Petesho, in the diocese of Lincoln, on an exchange of benefices with Robert Pyrie.

June 30. Westminster. Grant for life to John de Pulteneye, 'chivaler,' of free warren in all his demesne lands within the towns of Mynsterton, Pulteneye and Walcote, co. Leicester, provided they be not within the metes of the forest. By K.

May 15. Westminster. Grant for life to the king's servant John Marker, spigurnel of Chancery, of a messuage and 60 acres of land in Ronhale, co. Bedford, which Richard Ronhale, clerk, deceased, had for life of the grant of Richard II, which are extended at 20s. yearly and which he has of the king's commission at farm for 24s. yearly, to hold without rendering anything to the king. June 29. Westminster. *Inspeximus* and confirmation to the abbot and conyent of Tewkesbury of a charter dated at Carlisle, 1 July, 28 Edward I [*Charter Roll, 28 Edward I, No. 16*], inspecting and confirming earlier charters. For 40s. paid in the hanaper.

July 3. Westminster. Revocation of letters patent dated 30 November, 8 Henry IV, granting the keeping of the alien priory of Hagh, co. Lincoln, to Richard Beaugraunt and Thomas Bozon, esquire; as at the complaint of the said Richard that he was in peaceful possession of the priory and all its possessions by virtue of letters patent dated 21 January, 4 Henry IV, until he was hindered by the said Thomas by colour of the other letters patent, made against his will, the king directed the sheriff to summon the said Thomas to appear before him in Chancery at a certain day now past to show cause why the letters should not be revoked, and the sheriff returned that he summoned him by Alan Clerk of Hagh and Thomas Brandon of the same, and he appeared by Robert Syreston his attorney but could say nothing, and judgement was given against him.
