Kent whilst he was under the king's protection and on his service, carried off eight cows, value 10*l.*, besides other goods, and at Lenhem assaulted John Chelyngton, his servant. The like to John de Cavendissh, Roger de Kirketon, Roger de Fulthorpe, Giles Daubeney, John de Aylesbury, Thomas atte Hoo, John Holt and John Carvell, on complaint by Thomas de Stapelho, that Gilbert Aleyn, John Whitbred, Richard Cook of Seulesho, John Smyth, chaplain, Robert Feltwell, Adam Messenger, Matthew de Asshton and Gilbert de Asshton besieged him and his servants at Luton and Shitlyngdon, co. Bedford, in his houses (*mansa*) there for a long time, assaulted them, carried off his goods at Totyngdon and Tilbrok, besides depasturing his corn and grass at Shitlyngdon and still so threaten him and his men that his land remains uncultivated.
