

## MEMBRANES 8 and 7.

Oct. 8. Westminster. *Inspeximus* and confirmation, in favour of Henry, bishop of Norwich, and his successors, of a charter dated Westminster, 21 February, 12 Edward III. [*Charter Roll, 12 Edward III., No. 41*], inspecting and confirming two charters of Henry II., dated at Norwich [*circa 1157*] and Winchester respectively, a charter dated Acton Burnell, 4 October, 11 Edward I. [*Charter Roll, 12 Edward I., No. 3*], and a charter dated Lincoln, 30 August, 9 Edward II. [*Charter Roll, 9 Edward II., No. 3*].  
For 100s. paid in the hanaper.

The like, in favour of the same, along with the prior and convent of Norwich, of a charter of the same date [*Charter Roll, 12 Edward III., No. 42*], inspecting and confirming a charter dated Westminster, 4 March, 2 Edward II. [*Charter Roll, 2 Edward II., No. 30*], inspecting and confirming a charter dated Lanrecost, 5 October, 34 Edward I. ## MEMBRANE 6.

Dec. 14. Westminster. *Inspeximus* and confirmation, in favour of the burgesses of Clifton Dertemuth Hardenesse, of a charter dated Tower of London, 14 April, 15 Edward III. [*Charter Roll, 15 Edward III., No. 18*], being a grant to them, for their losses and services on the king's behalf, of divers liberties and franchises.

By the Great Council, because they made a balinger, as the bishop of Exeter has testified.

## MEMBRANES 5 and 4.

Oct. 20. Westminster. *Inspeximus* and confirmation, in favour of John, bishop of Lincoln, and his successors, of a charter dated Westminster, 15 February, 3 Edward III. [*Charter Roll, 3 Edward III., No. 51*], inspecting and confirming very many charters of William II., Henry I., Matilda, Stephen, and Henry II. [*Monasticon: vol. vi., p. 1272, in part.*]

## MEMBRANES 3, 2, and 1.

Oct. 20. Gloucester. *Inspeximus* and confirmation, in favour of the same, along with the dean and chapter of Lincoln, of a charter of the same date [*Charter Roll, 3 Edward III., Nos. 49 and 2*], inspecting and confirming (1) very many charters of Henry II., Richard I, John, Henry III., Edward I. (inspecting a charter of the abbot of Fécamp dated the morrow of the Ascension, 1292), and Edward II. (inspecting letters patent of Richard, sometime bishop of Lincoln, dated Bugeon, 1 July 1274), and (2) letters patent of John de Blyton, mayor of Lincoln, dated Lincoln, Monday after the feast of SS. Vedast and Amand, 1315. [*Monasticon: vol. vi., p. 1269, in part.*]
