Mandate to sheriffs, mayors, bailiffs and other ministers to arrest and bring before the king or council Walter Lovenaunt, clerk, and Ralph Daventre and Baldwin Taillour, his proctors, to stand their trial for proceedings at the Roman court in breach of a late ordinance of Parliament (imposing the penalties of the statute of [provisors] 25 Edward III.) in respect of the church of Raddeleve-on-Sore, which Henry de Blakeburne obtained by presentation of John de Wynewyk, now deceased, and to which, at the said Henry's resignation, William Julyan was presented by Richard de Wynewyk, brother and heir of the said John, and from which church the said Walter is attempting to expel him, under colour of a papal provision alleging that the right belongs not to a lay patron but to the Pope.
