Westminster. in the diocese of Norwich, to the church of Brede, in the diocese of  
Chichester, in the king's gift by reason of the temporalities of the alien  
abbey of Fécamp being in his hands on account of the war with France; on  
an exchange of benefices with Paul ———.
- Dec. 8. Grant, for life, to Thomas Murrieux of the custody of the Tower of  
Westminster. London. By p.s.
- Dec. 9. Grant to the bailiffs of Dorchester of pontage for three years for the repair  
Westminster. of the bridge over the Thames.
- Dec. 8. Pardon to John Rous for crenellating a house above the gate of his  
Westminster. manor of Ragele, co. Warwick, without licence; and licence for him to  
crenellate the remainder of the manor. By p.s. [1991.]
- Nov. 20. Exemption, for life, of Henry Grene, knight, from being put on assizes,  
Westminster. inquisitions, juries or recognisances, and from being made mayor, sheriff,

Westminster. Briwton, of a writing of Savaric, sometime bishop of Bath and Glastonbury,
