- June 10. Grant to John de Aklif, chaplain, of the chantry within the king's castle
Westminster. of Newcastle-on-Tyne.
- June 9. Grant to Nicholas Slake, king's clerk, prebendary of the prebend lately
Westminster. held by John de Saxton in St. George's chapel, Windsor castle, of the
houses and buildings lately occupied by him. By signet letter of K.
- June 9. Grant, for life, during the minority of the heir, to the king's knight,
Westminster. Peter de Courtenay of the custody of the king's park of Petirton and his
forests of Exemore, Nerechich and Mendep, in the king's hands among
other lands late of Edmund de Mortuo Mari, earl of March. By p.s.
- June 14. Grant, during the life of John de Aynesworth, to the king's uncle John,
Westminster. duke of Lancaster, of the custody of the manor of Middelton, co. Lancaster,
without rent, which the said John on the death of Matilda his wife held by
the courtesy and which came into the late king's hands through his outlawry
for the death of Adam son of Elias de Knolles; and remission to him of the
farm of 12*l.* now in demand therefor at the Exchequer. By p.s.
- June 14. Licence for the king's clerk, Hugh de Cotyngnam, prebendary of Effyng
Westminster. in the cathedral of Lymeryk in Ireland, now treasurer and secretary of the
queen, to absent himself from his lands in Ireland so long as he remains in
the service of the king and queen, notwithstanding the late ordinance in

- June 16. Presentation of John de Loughton, vicar of Alvethelee, in the diocese of
Westminster. London, to the church of Quynnton, in the diocese of Lincoln, in the king's
gift by reason of the alien priory of St. Andrew's, Northampton, being in
his hands on account of the war with France; on an exchange of benefices
with Roger Slaytburn.
- May 7. Presentation of Robert de Wyclyf, king's clerk, parson of Kirkeby
Westminster. Ravenswath, in the jurisdiction of Humphrey de Charleton, archdeacon
of Richemond, to the church of St. Rumbald, also in his jurisdiction, in
the king's gift by reason of his custody of the land and heir of Henry
son of Henry, son of Hugh, knight, tenant in chief, on an exchange of
benefices with Richard de Midelham.
- June 18. Licence, at the supplication of William de Courtenay, archbishop of
Westminster. Canterbury, for William de Topclyve to crenellate and fortify a small
'place' called 'Shoford' in the parish of Maideston, lately levelled by the
insurgents. By p.s. [2264.]
- June 5. Pardon to Roger del Ewerie *alias* Roger Fymoys of the forfeiture of his
Westminster. goods by reason of his outlawry on divers pleas of debt, the same having
been pardoned. By p.s.
- June 20. Appointment of John atte Hacche, deputy of Arnald Brocas, clerk of the
Westminster. works, as his purveyor of works at Wodestoke manor, to take workmen,
stone, timber and carriage for the same. By bill of Arnald.
- June 28.* Grant, for life, to Henry Ferrour, for his good service with the queen's
Westminster. horses, of the office of porter of Scardeburgh castle. [p.s. 2284.]
