Jan. 10. Commission *de walliis, fossatis, &c.*, to John, duke of Lancaster, Henry Westminster. de Percy, earl of Northumberland, Robert de Wylughby, Philip le Despenser, William Thorpe, knight, John Cressy, knight, Robert Leek, knight, William de Spaygne, John Hagh, Thomas Pynchebek, Thomas Claymond, Richard de la Launde and Roger Toup in the parts of Holand, co. Lincoln, the course of the river Neue between Wodelode and Spaldyng bridge and thence to the sea being obstructed by sand and other nuisances.

Dec. 6. Commission to John de Ulneston, sheriff of Norfolk and Suffolk, William Westminster. de Clopton, John de Roldeston, William Wynter, John White, Geoffrey de Somerton, John de Yelverton and Walter Lamberd to arrest and deliver to the warden of the Elete prison William Bryd of Colby, outlawed at the Husting court, London, for not appearing before the justices of the Bench to answer Robert de Muskham, parson of Overe, touching a debt of 99*l.* 16*s.* 8*d.*

Dec. 5. Commission to Laurence Dreu, Robert Bollok and Reginald Sheffield to Westminster. enquire touching the true boundary between a messuage in Rading, forfeited to the crown because it was found by inquisition of Nicholas Aston, escheator in the county of Berks, that Adam, son and heir of Richard Whitcote, granted it in mortmain, without licence, on St. Scolastica, 23 Edward III., to Hugh Oughtrade and John Selliche, sacrist of the church of St. Laurence, Rading, and their successors, sacrists thereof, for finding a chaplain to celebrate divine service therein, and a tenement held by David atte Hacche, adjoining the messuage, he, in default of proper bounds, claiming a great part of it.

Jan. 6. Commission to Walter Fitz Wauter, John Bourghcher, knight, and Westminster. Nicholas Prage, serjeant-at-arms, to arrest and bring before the king and council Walter Savare of Kirkeby in the hundred of Tendryng, co. Essex, who incited the commons of the county to resist the payment to Roger Kirketon and other collectors of the tenth and fifteenth last granted to the king by the commons of England.

Jan. 6. Commission to John de Morewell, serjeant-at-arms, to arrest and bring Westminster. before the king and council Thomas Fornham of Bury, who hindered by threats and otherwise the levying of 2,000 marks for a fine acknowledged in Chancery by him and others of that town.

Jan. 16. Commission to William de Walleworth and John Philipot, knights, to Westminster. audit the account of Hugh Frenyngham of Shordiche, to whom, by letters patent dated 28 December the king granted pavage for one year in aid of the repair of the highway between Halywell Cross and Saumforthill; on report that he converts certain of the moneys to his own use.

Jan. 16. The like to the same to audit the account of Hugh Frenyngham and Westminster. Richard Sadeler, both of Shordich, to whom by letters patent dated 12 October, 5 Richard II., the king granted pavage for one year in aid of the repair of the highway between the hospital of St. Mary without Bisshopesgate, London, and the church of Shordich.

Jan. 20. Commission of oyer and terminer to Robert Tresilian, Reginald Malyns, Westminster. Thomas Sakevill, Gilbert Wace and Nicholas Carrewc, touching the erection of certain weirs, mills, mill-ponds, stakes and kiddles in the Thames between Walyngford and Goryng, in the counties of Oxford and Berks contrary to the statute of 25 Edward III.
