Nov. 12. Pardon, for 20*l.* paid in the hanaper by Richard de Burley, knight, who has married Beatrice, late the wife of Thomas de Roos of Hamelak, knight, of the trespasses committed in the enfeoffment by the said Thomas of William Chetewynde, knight, Robert de Tynton, clerk, William Rempston and William Benyngholme of a moiety of the manor of Barston and Plumgarth, held of the king in chief, in the grant thereof by the latter to the said Thomas and Beatrice, in tail, and in the entry thereon of all parties, without licence, on account of which and by reason of the death of the said Thomas the said moiety was taken into the king's hands, and restitution to the said Richard and Beatrice of the premises as acquired.

Mandate to Thomas Blyth of Blyth, escheator in the county of Leicester, to take Richard's fealty and deliver the said moiety to them.

Nov. 11. Pardon to William Ibotson of Harpham for the death of Thomas Skynner of Harpham, killed on Tuesday after St. Barnabas, 7 Richard II. By p.s.

Nov. 8. Presentation of William Wryght, vicar of Leggesby in the diocese of Lincoln to the vicarage of Bondeby in the same diocese, in the king's gift by reason of the alien priory of [St.] Fromont being in his hands on account of the war with France; on an exchange of benefices with Thomas Beverley.

July 9. Licence, for 20 marks paid to the king, for the prior and convent of Roystone to acquire in mortmain lands and rents not held in chief to the yearly value of 10*l.* By p.s.

Nov. 4. Grant, for life, to the king's knight, John de Burley, of the custody during the war with France, of the alien priory of Wotton Waweyn, without rendering aught therefor, provided that its value does not exceed 46*l.* 13*s.* 4*d.* yearly, the rent which he was wont to pay for it at the Exchequer. By signet letter.

Nov. 7. Exemption, for life, at the instance of the earl of Nottingham, of the abbot of Croxton from being made collector or assessor of tenths, fifteenths, taxes, subsidies or other imposts granted to the king or his heirs by the clergy, against his will. By signet letter.

Nov. 6. Revocation of protection with clause *volumus* for one year granted 20 January last to Thomas Ruydyng as going on the king's service to Portugal in the company of Fernandes, master of the order of St. James of Portugal, on information that he is not preparing to go.

Oct. 25. Grant, in fee simple, to Simon de Bureley, under-chamberlain, of the manor of Chastelfrome, co. Hereford, the inheritance of Elizabeth Clodeshale, late the wife of William Deverose, knight, of the yearly value of 40 marks, which has been seised into the king's hands because she coved with others to murder Thomas Zeduyn, the king's esquire, and absconded. Sept. 13. Pardon to William le Maderer of Hulme for the death of Thomas Jankynson Dykson de Wynquik, killed at Wynquik on Sunday before St. Mark, 7 Richard II. By p.s. [3726.]
