April 19. Commission of oyer and terminer to Brian de Stapelton, William de Westminster. Melton, John Sayvyll, Robert Conestable of Flaynburgh, knights, the mayor of York, William Moubray, Richard Basy of Bilburgh, Robert de Howom, Thomas de Howom, John Berden, Simon de Quixlay, Thomas Thurkill, Robert Sauvage, John Houden and John de Sadyngton—upon complaint by the commonalty of the county of York that divers weirs, mills, kiddles, etc. have been newly placed in the water of Ouse, and others which were removed by searchers, in accordance with the ordinance of Parliament, have been replaced to the great obstruction of navigation—after survey thereof, to correct the said defaults, and enquire what weirs, etc. existed in the time of Edward I, and what have been subsequently set up, and to remove all obstructions in accordance with the ordinances of the Parliaments of 25 Edward I. and 45 Edward I. which are recited.

April 26. Appointment of John de Tudenham, knight, John de Staverton and Westminster. John Glemham, to enquire touching the complaint of the poor men of Wynston, co. Suffolk, that having from time out of mind been assessed with the men of Debenham at 8 marks only for one fifteenth, which has been levied on persons of both places, according to their lands and goods and chattels, the collectors of a moiety of the fifteenth last granted, have, from hatred to them and partiality to the men of Debenham, assessed them too highly, and to certify how much they ought to pay as their share and touching all the circumstances.

May 6. Appointment of John Bosvill, William de Rilleston and Robert de Westminster. Ursewik, knights, and William de Holme, Thomas Thurkell, Thomas Leonell, John de Ask, Thomas Elys, Alan de Katerhall, William Waweyn and Thomas Spense of Bowes, to enquire, by oath of men of the counties of York, Cumberland, Westmorland and Lancaster, touching the complaint of the master and brethren of the hospital of St. Leonard, York, that although they were endowed by the king's progenitors with certain thraves (*garbis*) called 'Petercorne,' the same are unjustly withheld, and to certify the names of those who withhold the same.
