Commission to William Hankford, Robert Hille, William Ryngeborn, John Forster, Henry Popham and Andrew atte Dene to enquire and certify touching the following circumstances: Although on 12 July last Geoffrey Newenton, Richard Tistede, Thomas Squyry and John Boteller became mainperners in Chancery, each in a penalty of 100*l.* for Richard Wayte, Gilbert Estene, Simon Jordan and Robert Jugeler, that the last named persons would not be guilty of unlawful assemblies to the disturbance of the people and that they would pursue their business in the form of law and not by armed power, yet, as the king has learned by complaint of William Upton and Katharine, his wife, they rebelliously assembled with Robert, parson of Clanefeld, John Worthere, John Levynton, 'tailleur' and many others unknown, and by force broke the close and houses of the said William and Katharine at Lymborn, co. Southampton, and assaulted and imprisoned the said Katharine, almost starving her whilst so imprisoned.
