Dec. 10. Westminster. Licence for the alienation in mortmain by Stephen de Herlethorpe, John de Clyveland, William de Buterwyk and William Peche of a messuage, four bovates of land, three acres and two-thirds of eight acres of meadow in Bulford, not held in chief and of the yearly value of 23s. as found by inquisition taken by William Frost, escheator in the county of York, to the abbot and convent of Rievaulx, in full satisfaction of lands, tenements and rents to the yearly value of 10*l.* which they had licence from the late king to acquire in mortmain; and for the same persons to grant to the said abbot and convent the reversion of the third part of the aforesaid eight acres, of the yearly value of 3s. 8*d.* which Thomas Meryngton and Joan, his wife, hold for the life of the said Joan, and which at her death revert to the said Stephen, John, William and William.

Feb. 14. Westminster. Ratification of the estate of Richard Spynneye as vicar of the parish church of Wytham in the diocese of London. By p.s.

Oct. 18. Westminster. Exemption, for life, of John Mareys of Wilts, who is 60 years old and more, from being put on assizes, juries, attainments, recognitions or inquisitions, and from being made coroner, trier of the same, arrayer or leader of men-at-arms, hobelers or archers, collector or controller of tenths, fifteenths or other tallages or subsidies, against his will. Feb. 15. Westminster. Pardon to [Robert] Rychegod of Sothewell, webster, a prisoner in Nottingham gaol, for the death of William de Bekyngham, of Sothewell, smith, as it appears by the record of William Thirnyng and the other justices of gaol-delivery that he killed him in self-defence.

Feb. 16. Westminster. Revocation of protection with clause *volumus* for one year lately granted to Roger Torfet, grocer and merchant of London, said to be on the king's service in the company of Henry de Percy, earl of Northumberland, captain of Calais, upon its defence, because he tarries in London on his own affairs, as appears by certificate of the sheriffs of London.

Feb. 17. Westminster. Ratification of the estate of Griffin Vaghan as parson of Llansanfrede in the diocese of St. Davids.

Feb. 16. Westminster. Licence for William Botereux 'le Fitz,' knight, to cross the sea with ten horses, ten servants, equipage and reasonable expenses. By p.s.

Feb. 16. Westminster. Presentation of Walter Upton to the parish church of Gwytheryn in the diocese of St. Asaph.

Feb. 13. Westminster. Ratification of the estate of John de Molyneux as parson of Thurstanston in the diocese of Coventry and Lichfeld.

Nov. 10. Westminster. Grant, during pleasure, to John Lounde, esquire, the king's leech, of the office of searcher of the river Wythom and all other weirs thence as far as Henlade, if the office is, and has heretofore been, given by the king, and is void, and no one has it by letters patent of the late king or the king. Feb. 12. Westminster. Pardon, for 6s. 8*d.* paid to the king by Bartholomew Holebym *alias* Holebeem, of his trespass in acquiring, in fee, from John Busshel *alias* Busschel, lord of Bradelegh, and entering on, without licence, a tenement with appurtenances in Nywaton Busschel and a close with appurtenances
