Feb. 13. Grant, for life, to the king's servant Alan Norreys of 100s. a year out of  
Westminster. the issues of the king's lordship of Walyngford, as received by William  
Snelle, late the king's armourer. By p.s. [10885.]

Feb. 10. Pardon to Baldwin othe Felde for the death of Simon Heyne, killed at  
Westminster. Kyngesnorton on Wednesday the feast of the Conception of St. Mary in  
the nineteenth year. By p.s.

Feb. 2. Pardon, for 20s. paid to the king by Nicholas Halle, to him for  
Westminster. acquiring for life from Thomas, earl of Nottingham, marshal of England  
and lord of Moubray and Segrave, all the said earl's lands and tenements,  
rents and services in Morton by Thame, held in chief, and entering  
thereon without licence, and grant that he may hold the premises as  
acquired.

Jan. 29. Licence for the alienation in mortmain by John Parker and William  
Westminster. Cokkes, chaplains, of a messuage and two virgates of land in Wasperton,  
co. Warwick, not held in chief, extended at 13s. 4d. a year, as found by  
inquisition taken before Alan Waldeyeve, late escheator in that county, to  
the prior and convent of Coventry, in part satisfaction, viz. 10 marks, of  
licence granted to them by the late king to acquire lands, tenements and  
rents to the value of 100*l.* a year.

Jan. 25. Licence, for 10s. paid to the king by the abbot of St. Augustine's,

letters patent dated 16 July, 8 Edward III, not being executed, for the

of Fifhide, which is of their own advowson, provided that a proper sum of

parishioners, and the vicar is sufficiently endowed as the diocesan shall  
order in accordance with the statute.
