Commission to John Caus and John Bitham, king's serjeant-at-arms, on complaint by Richard Genuret of the parish of St. Vincent, Rowan, William de la Neisse and Clays Reodo, merchant of St. Omer (*Aumero*) in France, that when their ships laden with wines and other merchandise were wrecked off the coast of Romenev and Hothe, co. Kent, although all the crews escaped alive to shore, certain of the inhabitants took the said goods as though they were wreck of the sea and refuse to restore them—to enquire and certify touching the premises.

Commission of oyer and terminer to Henry de Percy, earl of Northumberland, Ralph de Nevyll, knight, Robert de Nevyll, knight, John de Depeden, knight, John Ingelby, William Frost, mayor of York, Thomas Gray, Thomas Thurkill, and John Wylmot, after examining the weirs, mills, stanks, piles, pales and kidells placed in the river Ouse, co. York, to the hindrance of navigation contrary to the statute of the year 25 Edward III.
