- July 6.** Signification to J. bishop of Coventry and Lichfield, of the royal assent to the election of William de Tutbury, canon of Repyndon, to be prior of that house.

- July 8.** Presentation of Richard Jannus to the vicarage of Cors, void by the resignation of Ralph Flye, and in the king's gift by reason of the temporalities of the alien priory of Derhurst being in his hand on account of the war with France; directed to T. bishop of Worcester.
